MY STUDIES IN THE UK

Some people might know I spent last school year in the UK and I would like to share my experience with you.

Our English teacher in kvinta told us about the opportunity to study abroad in the UK, specifically at Alcester Grammar School (around 50km away from the third largest city in England - Birmingham). So I went there for a few days with our teacher and a couple of my classmates. They were also interested in studies in England for a Subject sampling evening where we had an option to try different subjects we were interested in because, in the end, you only choose four subjects to study. The next day we met our possible host families and talked to them about living at their place. When we returned, we only had a few days to decide whether to go or not, and I wasn't sure if I wanted to go, but as I said earlier, it would be a shame not to go, so I decided to take the opportunity.

When I arrived in September, the biggest shock for me was how British people eat - small breakfast, usually no lunches and then after the whole day with no food opulent dinners (which generally weren't that good – everyone knows British cuisine is BAD). Another surprise was when I came to school and found out that the lessons were 15 minutes longer than lessons in Czechia. But I don't want to talk just rubbish about it because there were mostly good things like having free/study periods during the day, the first lesson starting at 9:10, and most importantly, you could study your chosen subjects in-depth as there were only four of them. Also, we only had exams in special exam weeks, which were every few months, and we were tested on everything since the start of the school year, which I didn't enjoy, because once you screw up at one exam, it's tough to get a good mark at your finals in June. Considering there were no exams except the big ones, we had A LOT of homework (I'm talking about 1-2 hours of homework every day).



In the end, I'm grateful for this opportunity, and I would recommend it to everyone who is not scared of "living on their own" and having quite a lot of responsibilities.

CZECH PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS 2021

The next parliamentary elections will be held on October 8 - 9 2021. President of the Czech Republic Miloš Zeman announced his decision on December 29 2020, nearly 10 months before the elections. Andrej Babiš, leader of ANO 2011, has been prime minister of the Czech Republic since 2017 when his party won with 29,6% of the vote.

The latest opinion polls say that leader's party would receive 28% of the votes. Coalitions SPOLU and PirSTAN would be next with 23%. The main topics of the campaigns are pensioners, taxes, refugees and European Union.

The current government has been affected by many scandals and problems like Čapí hnízdo, Andrej Babiš jr., plagiarism and coronavirus. There have already been three attempts to overthrow the government, but the opposition has never received enough votes.

Experts expect higher voter turnout, which should be, however, affected by coronavirus measures. In 2017, the voter turnout was 60,87%, and for 2021 is expected 67%. Nevertheless, it will not be easy to form a majority government with more than a half in the Chamber of Deputies.



RED SPECIAL

The Red special is not just an ordinary guitar. It is probably the most famous and recognizable guitar in the world. This masterpiece is an inseparable part of Brian May, best known as the guitarist of the legendary band Queen.

I think the most exciting thing about this guitar is its history and construction of the guitar. It was designed and built by Brian and his father in the early 1960s when Brian was a teenager. The guitar is entirely homemade, using materials that were available at the time. Brian, for example, used wood from an old fireplace to make the neck of the guitar or motorbike valve springs for the tremolo system. The Red Special has a unique sound and many unusual features you won't find on any other guitar. These include, for example, pickup wiring, on/off switches, phase switches or the unique tremolo system.

The Red Special has been used on most of Queen's studio albums and live performances and during Brian May's solo career. The guitar has already undergone several restorations. But it's been almost 60 years, and Brian is still using the original one.

Do you know what Polaroid is? It was once a factory producing instant cameras for selfdeveloping photos. It went bankrupt in 2001 and now it has risen back from the ashes. What about music collectors? No one wants CDs anymore in such quantities as LP vinyl records.

You might ask me why? People are simply fed up with everything being untouchable online in a digital form. When you buy music just like a record for a PC or mobile phone, it never has the same feeling as unpacking a large LP disc and putting it on a gramophone. It is also said that LPs have the best sound, which is inimitable. There is even one more advantage. Imagine buying your music just online and then someone hacks your account and steals everything just by turning his computer on. Have you ever used a full roll of a camera film and then developed the photos? The feeling when you finally see the images after all the work it took. I know when you mess it up, it is worse than in the digital world, because there you can simply take thousands of pictures. However, in my own experience, digital cameras do not force you to think about your photos or print them at all. It is a shame. Shooting with a film-based camera that does not do everything for you, is more challenging because you have to learn at least the simple basics of photography which helps you even in the digital world.

In the end, even if the analogue Renaissance happens just out of curiosity, it is nice that people in this consumer world have not thrown everything away, just because it is not cool or modern. As an enthusiastic amateur film photographer, I am glad to see that those simple old well-made cameras of pure steel and glass are not just catching dust on somebody's shelf or are not just thrown away, but are being used more and more. Imagine the stories behind those ordinary things of daily life. They have stories behind them because people lived them out. Not online. It is great that more people want to live in the real world and not just in the illusion of social media. If the film camera is the thing that invites you to go out and enjoy the moment in your special way, then do it, what are you waiting for? Outside, there is the whole world to explore. Long live the Analogue!

PLASTIC POLLUTION

PRFFACE

The environmental outlook for the future is unpredictable. Problems such as acid deposition, global warming, chlorofluorocarbons, ozone depletion and more importantly plastic pollution urgently require solutions and concerted action is needed to deal with these. In this essay, I intend to acquaint the reader with the term plastic pollution. In addition, I also want to shed more light on some of the problems which are interwoven with this long-term issue.

WHAT IS PLASTIC POLLUTION?

Plastic pollution is a term that is used when some plastic particles such as plastic bags and microbeads pile up to such an extent that it has an adverse effect on both aquatic and terrestrial ecosystems. The threat of plastic debris was overlooked for many years. Only recently did a few highly esteemed scientists and experts on marine life come to the conclusion that plastics pose a great environmental threat to our planet. Since plastics are inexpensive and durable, they can be found in every single part of the planet.

There are approximately two pivotal factors that gave rise to the increase of plastics in general. Firstly, the durability of these materials has had a direct impact on how long they are present in oceans and

soil before they degrade. Secondly, plastics are synthetic organic polymers and their chemical structure is undoubtedly less susceptible to many natural processes of degradation.

CAUSES

While it might not be possible to obtain some accurate and reliable estimates of the

entire extent of plastic debris in the marine environment, marine biologists already know that the quantities are substantial as merchant ships dispose of 639 000 plastic containers every day across the world. Hence, ships are one of the major causes of plastic pollution. Nevertheless, it is also known that countries which do not show any willingness to tackle the problem of plastic waste in an efficient and eco-friendly way prefer transporting them to other countries where there is a high risk of plastics winding up in the oceans sooner or later.

TYPES OF PLASTIC DEBRIS

Hitherto, three forms of plastic that are conducive to increasing the levels of pollution have been discovered: microplastics, macro-plastics as well as mega-plastics. Both micro and mega- have their highest levels of prevalence in the Northern Hemisphere. Plastic debris can be broken down into two categories: primary and secondary. Primary plastics always retain their original form and shape (e.g., cigarette butts, microbeads) when gathered whereas secondary plastics contain many smaller particles which stem from the degradation process.

PLASTIC PRODUCTION AND MAJOR PLASTIC POLLUTING COUNTRIES

According to a study published by Science, it is believed that in 2018 the overall number of plastics which end up in the oceans is 513 million tonnes. 83,1% of this amount hails from countries such as China, the Philippines, Indonesia, Thailand, Malaysia and so on., China, which is widely thought to be one of the major sources of oceanic plastic pollution, largely due to the huge quantities of waste flowing out to sea

through the Yangtze River, said that its citizens needed to learn to live in an increasingly plastic-free and eco-friendly way and that industry would have to adapt.

Plastics account for 10% of discarded waste. As a rule, it takes a few decades before plastics fully degrade. Widely used plastics do not naturally degrade to a significant degree when exposed to ceaseless rain and other natural processes in the environment. It might not come as a surprise since one of the primary reasons for its common usage is the presence of polymers which are dissolved in plastics. They are notorious for their exceptionally high stability and durability. They are able to withstand even the most extreme conditions. There are four mechanisms by which plastics degrade in the environment: hydrolytic degradation, biodegradation caused by a microorganism, thermooxidative degradation and finally photodegradation. Generally speaking, the time which plastics take to fully degrade cannot be precisely determined as it hinges on a wide range of factors including the overall quality of the particular material. What's more, it cannot be omitted that the process of degradation can be slowed down due to lower temperatures as well as oxygen availability. Thus, it can take up to an unacceptable number of years for plastics to fully degrade.

PLASTICS IN THE ENVIRONMENT AND THE IMPACTS OF PLASTIC POLLUTION Effects on animals

The severe repercussions of plastics on the environment are unquestionable. Plastic debris poses the greatest threat to our planet. One of the main concerns is that certain species can often be found entangled in such items. Moreover, it has also been discovered that 97% of animals such as cetaceans, fur seals, sharks, marine birds and sea turtles have signs of ingestion of plastics after several of them underwent an autopsy. Marine birds are especially prone to ingestion of plastics that they mistake for food. Plastic ingested by such animals is stuck in the digestive system and can result in gastrointestinal

blockage, decreased secretion of gastric enzymes and more importantly decreased feeding stimuli.

Effects on humans

During the past few years, several health organizations carried out a very close examination of certain plastics such as bisphenol A (BRA), PBD and polybrominated diphenyl ether (PBDE) and have found some disconcerting things. PBD is believed to be extremely harmful to the human body as it damages thyroid hormones that are crucial to our metabolism, growth and development of the human body. One of the most endangered groups is pregnant women and children. Despite the fact that governments across the world are trying to do everything in their power to use alternative and safer materials in order to come to grips with this issue, 95% of Americans do still have detectable trace amounts of BPA in their urine. Longterm exposure to such chemicals can have a detrimental effect on the human body in terms of fertility, reproduction, sexual maturation.

REDUCTION EFFORTS

It goes without saying that international companies are doing everything in their power to curtail the number of plastic bags, and these are charged. This has sowed the seeds towards mitigating the impact of the human footprint on the environment.

Other companies and organizations such as The Guardian have put in place the use of biodegradable plastics to deliver their newspapers. These materials do have some drawbacks but they offer many of the advantages that their poisonous predecessors possessed.

CONCLUSION

In a nutshell, there is no gainsaying that plastic pollution is a long-term issue which has had a detrimental impact on our society. It impacts every aspect of our lives and the only way forward is to cut down on the number of plastics. People should use products made of sustainable materials. The ubiquitous presence of plastics has also had a negative impact on submarine life and therefore, it is an important issue for those groups of people who are considerate of the environment.
